## SATS

Our Y6 children have taken part in a busy SATs week along with other Y6 children across the country. I am sure that they all did their best and I'm also sure they are now looking forward to the weekend! Other children across the school have also taken part in an assessment week and Y2 children will be undertaking their SATs teacher assessments this month, so we are all involved in one way or another!

## REPORTS

Teachers are currently writing end of year reports for each child which will outline their progress in each curriculum area. Following feedback from last year, individual grades will not be given, but strengths and areas for development will be included for each subject.

## SWIMMING

The children are enjoying their extra swimming lessons. The heated changing rooms have been very well received and the children are making good progress. Our next plan is to get the interior walls of the changing rooms painted with murals selected by the School Council.

Recently our Y6 children took part in a local school Swimming Gala which was held at MVC. We did



really well, competing against 7 other primary schools and winning the trophy by a long way, which was great. We also won every race except two, and both of those were closely contested. A very well done to all concerned: you made us really proud. ## MATHS CHALLENGE

We also did really well in the County Maths Challenge, an annual event to which pupils that score well in an entry test are invited. In our first local heat we came a close second to Bourn Primary, and we hope to be invited to the next round based on being closest runners up. Well done to Reece Andrade, Hope Winter, Darienne Chesham and Joshua Bates who took part representing our school.

## PARKING

Our neighbours, the Baptist Church, kindly allow parents of children attending Melbourn Primary to park in their driveway at the beginning and end of the school day. Please be reminded that this is a privilege not a right, as there have been a couple of inconsiderate acts of parking recently. The Church would also like to inform parents that during the period June 21<sup>st</sup> until July 19<sup>th</sup>, they will host the Friends of Chernobyl Children's Charity and as such the car park will be much busier than usual. Yet again, we have had reports of parents parking on the yellow zig zag lines outside school, this of course increases the risk to our pupils, and therefore can parents ensure they park correctly when dropping their children at school.

**HEALTH ISSUES**

We have had a bout of sickness and diarrhoea in school of late. Please be reminded that current guidance states that children should remain at home for 48 hours after the last bout, to prevent further outbreaks. Cold symptoms have also been in evidence so remind children about using tissues and hand washing. On a final health note, several cases of threadworms have been confirmed. The symptoms of this are an itchy bottom and constant hunger. The condition can easily be treated by an over the counter medicine, but bedlinen and towels must also be washed on a hot cycle. Threadworms can be prevented by lots of careful handwashing (as can swine flu!) so the message is hand wash, hand wash, hand wash! The school has purchased anti-bacterial hand gel and school cleaners have been instructed to disinfect all high density surfaces such as door handles. There have also been some cases of headlice in the school, bug buster combs are available from the office at a cost of £1.

**NEW FENCES**

You may have noticed the colourful picket style fences which have been erected on the patios of our KS2 classes. These extend the classroom spaces to include an outside area as well as making organisation of the children easier at the beginning and end of the school day. They are not playpens for toddlers!! Please do keep small children outside of these areas so that work in the classrooms can continue undisturbed until the end of the school day.

**CYCLE RACKS**

We have already outgrown our new cycle racks which is great news, so I have managed to fund two additional "minipods" on which both cycles and scooters can be stored. These are located both next to the swimming pool and near the entrance from Orchard Road. If you come in that way, please park your bicycles/scooters at the red minipod and this will save congestion near the offices. I am pleased to say that children are remembering to wear their cycle helmets (which can be stored with their bicycles) as well as being accompanied by an adult. Y6 Cycling Proficiency training will begin soon. Please remember that for safety reasons children (and parents!) should not ride bicycles whilst on the school premises.

**BUILDING WORKS**

We have been advised by one of our neighbours at 43 High St, that building works have commenced on their premises. This should not

#### EXTENDED SERVICES

We would need to demonstrate the need for at least 35 places before we could seriously look at this provision. A new Orienteering Club will take place later in the term, run by one of the school's Healthy Lifestyles Mentors, details to follow.

Fortune smiled on us this year with the weather and the PTFA and school managed to raise close to £3000! This was a fantastic community event attended by many local residents including senior citizens and residents of Meldreth Manor. Our musicians “busked” and managed to raise over £50 “in the hat”. It was great to see them perform so confidently. Class stalls run by teachers and our children were well attended and raised plenty too. Many thanks to all sponsors (of raffle prizes), and to the PTFA, staff, children and community members who made this day such a success.
